

FROM THE DIRECTOR'S DESK

It's advocacy time here in Iowa with the legislative session in full swing. There are several bills that made it past the first funnel last week that are noteworthy. House File 570 eliminates the monthly budget maximum, or cap, for individuals eligible for the Medicaid Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) brain injury waiver.



There are currently four bills related to guardianships: SF 424 and HSB 22 relate to adult guardianships, both seeking to strength protections. SF 425 and HSB118 relate to juvenile guardianships, stipulating when the courts may appoint a guardianship and juvenile court jurisdiction over minor guardianship proceedings.

There are several bills looking to remove Long Term Services and Supports (LTSS) from the managed care system. All of these were filed by democrats so the current belief is that none will survive.

Another bill of interest is SF 41, which exempts wages of persons working for nonprofits who provide services to disabled individuals. Hence a direct support professional (DSP) who works for a nonprofit would no longer have to pay taxes on wages earned.

If you are interested in sharing your opinion with your elected officials on the various bills still active it is easy to do so. It is important that you not only let your voice be heard on things in which you disagree with, but also on the things you support!

You can find your local legislators by going to www.legis.iowa.gov. Then click on 'Find Your Legislator'. Type in the town you live in and hit 'Search'. A list will pop up with a picture of your senator or representative. If you click on each of their names it will give you a great deal of information, including their email. As a helpful hint, their emails all end with @legis.iowa.gov. So Liz Mathis, for example, can be reached at liz.mathis@legis.iowa.gov. If you want to mail them your opinions they can be reached at State Capitol Des Moines, IA 50319. To send a message directly to Governor Reynolds, go to www.governor.iowa.gov/contact. From here it is very easy to register your opinion right from this site. If you wish to mail your stories or concerns the governor may be reached at Governor Reynolds 1007 E. NEW MANAGED CARE ORGANIZATION BEGINS TO ACCEPT MEMBERS

Iowa Total Care is the name of the new managed care organization (MCO) in Iowa. Beginning March 4th all members who are funded by one of the MCO's will be in an Open Choice Period. This will last through June 18th. During this time anyone can choose which of the three MCO's they wish to enroll with for coverage starting July 1st, 2019. Until then, you will remain with your current MCO funder.



Throughout March, Iowa Medicaid Enterprise (IME) will be mailing MCO assignment letters to all Iowa Healthlink members. If your services are managed/funded by Amerigroup or United Healthcare, please look for a letter in the mail. Some individuals may be reassigned to a different MCO, but can choose a different plan. If you receive a letter telling you that you have been reassigned to a new/different MCO, and you are ok with this, you do not have to do anything. If you are NOT ok with the change, and want to stay with your current MCO, or try another, then you MUST contact IME Member Services by June 18th! We will send out additional information in the April Challenger. When you get your letter please feel free to share it with your Arc direct service worker or your Arc Coordinator. We will be happy to go over it with you and help.

SPECIAL EDUCATION RULE CHANGES

The Iowa State Board of Education has recently made changes to Iowa's special education rules related to graduation and the definition of a regular high school diploma. The changes made were to be consistent with the required language in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The change means it will no longer be permissible to award a high school diploma based solely on IEP goal attainment.



In Iowa, the minimum graduation requirements are four years of English, three years each of math, social studies and science, and completion of your districts expectations for physical education. It will be very important that your child's IEP Team develop a pathway that meet these requirements in order to achieve a regular high school diploma. Further information may be obtained by contacting your local AEA, the Iowa Department of Education, or the ASK Resource Center.

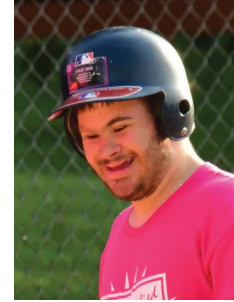

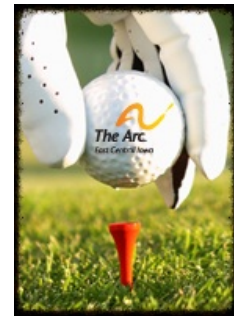
