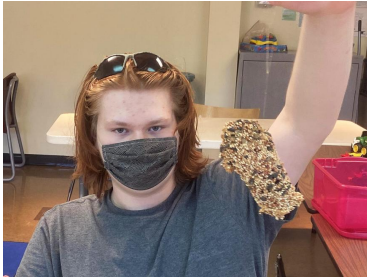

PROGRAMS AT THE ARC

The Arc programs are beginning to open up and we could not be more excited! Our process for reopening the programs included a survey out to the participants for their valued feedback, analyzing and revamping our space, procuring personal protective equipment and cleaning supplies, and adapting our policies and procedures to align with best practices for

mitigating the spread of COVID-19. We took a slow and phased in approach to reopening and continue to work towards operating at full capacity.



Our school age **Daycare** was the first program to reopen, on June 8th. There are many additional protocols and procedures in place now to account for social distancing and sanitation requirements. All of our staff, consumers, and families have been very patient, flexible, and understanding of our new processes. We continue to learn as we go and make changes as needed. The participants are kept busy doing arts and crafts, playing games, taking virtual tours,

and going outside for walks and fresh air every chance they get. **CHOICE** followed shortly after, with a reopening date of June 18th.

Our next program to open was **Summer Day** on June 16th, just one week past the original start date, due to having to secure a different location. Veritas Church has been so kind and welcoming to us, and we are very thankful for their partnership this summer. While Summer Day looks very different this year without a swimming pool or other field trips, the staff have put together some great in-house activities for each of the rooms.



The Arc's **Day Habilitation** program reopened on June 18th. We have had to make some changes to the schedule, activities, and number of participants served each day, and we look forward to expanding the program again, as soon as we can. DayHab groups are assigned to an area in the building where they spend their day doing arts and crafts, playing games, and building their interpersonal skills, while social distancing.

Also on June 18th, the **Project SEARCH** participants returned to UnityPoint - St. Luke's Hospital to wrap up their classroom work. In order to practice social distancing, the class has been split into a morning session and afternoon session. The hospital also provided a larger space to use for classroom time. The participants will finish the program on June 26th. A graduation ceremony will be planned for a later date. Upon completion of Project SEARCH the participants will transition to Supported Employment Services.



Supported Employment and **In-home Services** have remained available throughout the pandemic. Service delivery continues to grow in these areas.

Our **Service Center (groups and getaways)** has a target date of reopening July 8th. Emily is hard at work developing a phased-in schedule of activities.

All staff and consumers complete a COVID-19 health screening prior to every shift. Staff are required to wear face masks and consumers are highly encouraged to do so, as tolerated. We are very excited to be back with our consumers and providing the services they want and need. Please reach out to your Service & Support Coordinator if you have a service need or any questions.
